Yoon taking stock

At-large City Councilor Sam Yoon is conducting two e-surveys of city residents on their views about Boston public schools and public safety. As city budget hearings continue, Yoon is asking for input from Boston residents about class size, MCAS testing and school infrastructure needs, among other things.

"The city's schools are bridges to the future of Boston," said Yoon in a press release. "As the city council makes its budgetary decisions, I want to know from residents whether Boston public schools are preparing our children for a global economy. These decisions are literally the most important that the city makes all year, and I want to make sure I'm representing my constituents' interests well."

Yoon is also seeking resident input on public safety and crime. "Addressing Boston's public safety concerns is priority #1 for me," said Yoon in a another press release. "Our city has experienced so many needless deaths and so much tragedy in the last few years; it's time to put a stop to it. ... I want to make sure our city budget is reflecting these essential concerns."

To date, Yoon has conducted three e-surveys (the first focused on residents' overall priorities for the city budget), which have drawn more than 850 responses. Visit www.samyoon.com for more information.
